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
MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Army Directive 2011-10 (Modifying the Orders Program of the Military Personnel System to Facilitate Army Operations on a Joint Base)

1. Military Personnel Services (MILPERS) will be integrated at joint bases where the Army is the supported component once those bases reach full operational capability. Generally, authority to execute this MILPERS function must derive from Army authorities. This directive provides authority to execute an orders program at joint bases in accordance with Army policy.
2. Notwithstanding any provision of another order, regulation, pamphlet, memorandum of understanding or like agreement, standing operating procedure or common practice, the senior U.S. Army officer among those officers who are regularly assigned to command an Army unit, organization or element assigned to a joint base where the Army is the supported component:
 - a. Shall ensure the establishment, resourcing and operation of an orders program that accomplishes the requirements established by Army Regulation (AR) 600-8-105 (Military Orders), dated 28 October 1994, for all Army personnel assigned or attached to, serving on or supported by the joint base.
 - b. Is hereby granted all authorities necessary to issue all manner of orders contemplated by AR 600-8-105, subject to compliance with the provisions of that regulation and other applicable authorities.
3. The senior, regularly assigned commanding officer may further delegate all or part of this authority. A further delegation of authority shall not be effective unless a copy of the delegation is provided to the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-1. Copies shall be maintained by the official delegating the authority and the official to whom the authority is delegated. The senior, regularly assigned commanding officer will remain cognizant of and responsible for any and all actions taken pursuant to the delegated authority.
4. The Deputy Chief of Staff, G-1 remains responsible for establishing all personnel policies relating to the Army orders program. The Commanding General, U.S. Army Human Resources Command will establish standards and mandated operating tasks for the orders program in accordance with applicable joint base authorities and Army obligations pursuant to joint base memorandums of agreement.

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5. The provisions of this Army directive are effective immediately. As appropriate, the policy and guidance in this directive will be incorporated into the next revision of AR 600-8-105, dated 28 October 1994.
