I.—**FORT TOTTEN, NEW YORK.**—Effective 30 June 1949, the Fort Totten Army Medical Center, Fort Totten, New York, including the Fort Totten General Hospital, will be discontinued.

II.—**SAN ANTONIO GENERAL DEPOT, U. S. ARMY, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS.**—Effective 30 June 1949, the Medical Section of San Antonio General Depot, U. S. Army, San Antonio, Texas, will be discontinued.

III.—**TILTON GENERAL HOSPITAL, FORT DIX, NEW JERSEY.**—Effective 30 June 1949, Tilton General Hospital, Fort Dix, New Jersey, will be discontinued. The hospital facilities will revert to the Fort Dix station hospital.
