REPUBLIC OF KOREA PRESIDENTIAL UNIT CITATION

awarded by citation dated 1 October 1953, by Syngman Rhee, President of the Republic of Korea, for exceptionally meritorious service to the Republic of Korea during the period 11 July 1952 through 1 October 1953, with citation as follows:

The Korean Communications Zone was activated on 11 July 1952 and assigned the mission of completely or partially supporting all friendly forces in Korea. The tremendous difficulties encountered in assuming responsibilities of such magnitude were overcome through planning and sound leadership. In spite of language barriers, personnel of the Korean Communications Zone contributed to the harmonious placing into operation a comprehensive economic aid and relief program for the Republic of Korea. This monumental task involved the supervision and control of the major ports, transportation and communication facilities, and coordination with the United Nations Korea Reconstruction Agency.

Under the supervision of the Korean Communications Zone, millions of dollars of economic aid, supplies and equipment were furnished to thousands of Korean people afflicted by the ravages of war. Critical materials were furnished for family housing, hospitals, and welfare institutions. The establishment of a Foreign Language Institute in Pusan proved to be a distinct contribu-

Realizing that the people of Korea were confronted with a critical shortage of medical doctors because of reduced teaching staffs in the medical schools, the Korean Communications Zone, with exceptional ingenuity and resourcefulness, organized a teaching assistance program which resulted in the improvement and expansion of medical education in Korea. Through the joint effort of Koreans and the Korean Communications Zone personnel, an aggressive program was developed to rehabilitate electric power facilities which contributed immeasurably to the health, comfort and welfare of the civilian population. The people of the Republic of Korea will remember with profound gratitude the services rendered by the personnel of the Korean Communications Zone whose performance and devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.
