I. DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the act of Congress approved 9 July 1918, the Distinguished Service Medal (First Oak Leaf Cluster) for exceptionally meritorious and distinguished service in a position of great responsibility is awarded to:

Major General *John B. Medaris*, United States Army. October 1957 to January 1960.

II. LEGION OF MERIT. 1. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 20 July 1942, and Executive Order 10600, 15 March 1955, the Legion of Merit for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service is awarded posthumously to:

Colonel *William E. Maulsby, Jr.*, Armor, United States Army. September 1947 to January 1960.

2. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 20 July 1942, and Executive Order 10600, 15 March 1955, the Legion of Merit (First Oak Leaf Cluster) for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service is awarded posthumously to:

Colonel *James L. Frink, Jr.*, Artillery, United States Army. November 1950 to June 1959.

Major General *Olaf H. Kyster, Jr.*, United States Army. April 1946 to June 1950.

III. LEGION OF MERIT. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 20 July 1942, and Executive Order 10600, 15 March 1955, the Legion of Merit (First Oak Leaf Cluster) for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service is awarded to:

Major General *Albert F. Cassevant*, United States Army. September 1947 to January 1960.

Colonel *Charles D. Golman*, Artillery, United States Army. July 1954 to January 1960.

Colonel *St. Elmo P. Tyner*, Infantry, United States Army. June 1957 to November 1959. (This award supersedes so much of General Orders No. 59, Headquarters United States Army Caribbean, dated 12 August 1959, as pertains to the previous award of the Commendation Ribbon with Metal Pendant to Colonel Tyner for meritorious achievement during the period 26 June 1957 to 13 July 1959.)

IV. LEGION OF MERIT. 1. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 20 July 1942, and Executive Order 10600, 15 March 1955, the Legion of Merit (Degree of Commander) for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service is awarded to:

General *P'eng Meng-Ch'ia*, Chinese Army. July 1957 to November 1958.

2. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 20 July 1942, and Executive Order 10600, 15 March 1955, the Legion of Merit (Degree of Officer) for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service is awarded to:

Colonel *Danu'dirdjo Ashari*, Indonesian Army. October 1956 to August 1959.

Brigadier General *Hugo Fuentes*, Venezuelan Army. March to October 1958.

3. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 20 July 1942, and Executive Order 10600, 15 March 1955, the Legion Merit (Degree of Officer) (Second Award) for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service is awarded to:

Commodore *Lee Song Ho*, Republic of Korea Navy. September 1957 to January 1959.

V. SOLDIER'S MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 2 July 1926, a Soldier's Medal for heroism, not involving actual conflict with an enemy is awarded to:

Private First Class *Richard McGraw*, United States Army, member of the 5th Training Regiment, United States Army Training Center, Infantry, Fort Jackson, South Carolina, distinguished himself by heroism on December 1959. Private McGraw was performing duty on Remagen Range and was responsible for supervising the training of basic recruits in live fragmentation grenade handling. A trainee undergoing instruction tossed an activated grenade which hit the top of the protective barricade and bounced back to the throwing bay, endangering the lives of all personnel in that area. Quickly realizing the immediate danger involved, Private McGraw unhesitatingly shouted the alarm. Without concern for his own personal safety, he lunged forward approximately ten feet, seized the grenade and, with only seconds to spare, tossed it out into the impact area where it instantly exploded. Private McGraw's quick judgment, presence of mind and courageous action in this sudden emergency prevented serious injury or death to personnel within the area, and reflect distinct credit upon himself and the military service.

Master Sergeant *Thomas F. King*, United States Army. June 1957 to June 1959.

Lieutenant Colonel *Gerald A. Lake*, General Staff (Artillery), United States Army. September 1956 to December 1959.

Lieutenant Colonel *Arthur L. Lambert*, Armor, United States Army, January to December 1959.

Captain *James B. McArthur*, General Staff (Medical Service Corps), United States Army. December 1955 to December 1959.

Colonel *John W. McDonald*, Quartermaster Corps, United States Army. April 1958 to February 1960.

Major *J. W. Smith*, Armor, United States Army. June 1957 to January 1960.

Colonel *Howard K. Eggleston*, General Staff (Corps of Engineers), United States Army. June 1958 to October 1959.

Colonel *Frederic N. Nichorn*, Ordnance Corps, United States Army. April 1958 to January 1960.

Lieutenant Colonel *Richard R. Antwhistle*, Ordnance Corps, United States Army. July 1956 to September 1959.

Lieutenant Colonel *William B. Erwin*, General Staff (Corps of Engineers), United States Army. January 1956 to November 1959.

VII. MEDAL OF HONOR. So much of Section V, General Orders Number 22, Department of the Army, 1959, as pertains to award of the Medal of Honor to Brigadier General *James H. Doolittle*, USA, as reads "Brigadier General (then Colonel)" is amended to read "Brigadier General (then Lieutenant Colonel)".

VIII. COMMENDATION RIBBON WITH METAL PENDANT. So much of paragraph 1, Section IV, General Orders Number 1, Department of the Army, 1960, as pertains to award of the Commendation Ribbon with Metal Pendant to Lieutenant Colonel *Theodore B. Ward*, Transportation Corps, United States Army, as reads "Commendation Ribbon with Metal Pendant" is amended to read "Commendation Ribbon with Metal Pendant (First Oak Leaf Cluster)".
