ESTABLISHMENT OF THE U.S. ARMY TEST AND EVALUATION OFFICE

1. Effective 1 March 2008, all functions, personnel, equipment, and resources of the Test and Evaluation Management Agency (UIC: CSW0ZUAA) and the Office of the Test and Evaluation Executive (UIC: SAW00FAA) are consolidated and realigned under the authority, direction, and control of the Deputy Under Secretary of the Army (DUSA) and established as the Test and Evaluation Office (TEO) (UIC: SAW00FAA). The Director, TEO reports to the DUSA and serves as the senior advisor to the Secretary of the Army and the Chief of Staff, Army, on all Army test and evaluation matters. The duties and responsibilities of the TEO include—

a. Advising the Army Systems Acquisition Review Council (ASARC), the Army Requirements Oversight Council (AROC), and overarching integrated product teams (OIPs) on test and evaluation matters.

b. Approving test-related documentation for the Secretary of the Army and forwarding it, as appropriate, to the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD).

c. Coordinating test and evaluation matters with the Joint Staff and OSD, to include serving as principal Army interface on matters of test and evaluation with the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics (USD(ATL)) and the Director, Operational Test and Evaluation.

d. Overseeing all Army test and evaluation missions and functions, to include formulating overarching Army test and evaluation strategy, policy, and program direction, providing policy oversight, and managing resources.

2. In addition, the Director, TEO serves as the Testing and Evaluation Executive for the DOD Chemical and Biological Defense Program in accordance with USD(ATL) memorandum, subject: Implementation Plan for the Management of the Chemical and Biological Defense Program (CBDP), dated 22 April 2003 and any successor documents.
