VIETNAMESE CROSS OF GALLANTRY WITH PALM—GO 21, 31, 1969, amended.....	II

***I—MERITORIOUS UNIT COMMENDATION.*** By direction of the Secretary of the Army, under the provisions of paragraph 203, AR 672-5-1, the Meritorious Unit Commendation is awarded the following named units of the United States Army for exceptionally meritorious achievement in the performance of outstanding service during the periods indicated:

1. THE HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS DETACHMENT, 18TH MILITARY POLICE BRIGADE and its attached units:
  - 46th Military History Detachment—for the period 1 April 1968 through 31 October 1968
  - 458th Transportation Company—for the period 28 March 1968 through 31 October 1968

The citation reads as follows:  
 The HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS DETACHMENT, 18TH MILITARY POLICE BRIGADE and its attached units distinguished themselves in support of military operations in the Republic of Vietnam during the period 26 September 1967 through 31 October 1968. As command and control headquarters for all non-tactical military police organizations in the Republic of Vietnam, the officers and men of the detachment displayed extraordinary dedication, tenacity and professionalism in sustaining subordinate commands dispersed throughout the theater. With unrelenting effort, they labored far in excess of the normal duty hours to ensure that all elements of the brigade maintained a high level of security at their assigned areas of surveillance. Displaying superb foresight and organizational expertise, the members of HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS DETACHMENT, 18TH MILITARY POLICE BRIGADE were particularly successful in rendering route reconnaissance, convoy escort and security; in providing a safeguard for critical installations and urban areas and in controlling and securing the Long Binh Post tactical area of responsibility. The HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY, 29TH GENERAL SUPPORT GROUP and its attached units distinguished themselves in support of military operations in the Republic of Vietnam during the period 20 July 1966 through 30 June 1968. Demonstrating exceptional foresight and organizational expertise, the officers and men of the company successfully planned, coordinated and supervised the administrative and logistical support of the divisional and nondivisional units deployed throughout the III Corps Tactical Zone. By the efficient employment of available resources and capabilities, they successfully established forward supply areas for the provision of all classes of supply, services and back-up maintenance support for tactical units engaged in Operations TOLEDO, TULSA, SHENANDOAH, ATTLEBORO, CEDAR FALLS, JUNCTION CITY, MANHATTAN, YELLOWSTONE, FARGO, and SAN ANGELO. By providing the guidance and supervision necessary to effectively stage three infantry brigades and to sponsor thirty lesser units, the members of HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY, 29TH GENERAL SUPPORT GROUP assured that adequate supplies, laundry and bathing facilities and potable water were available to these organizations. Through their determined efforts, the unit's personnel succeeded in upgrading unsatisfactory organizational maintenance practices and, by expeditiously supplying critical repair parts, they significantly decreased the equipment maintenance deadline rates. By continually rendering the optimum in logistical support, they materially advanced the free world struggle against Communist aggression in the Republic of Vietnam. The 69TH SIGNAL BATTALION and its assigned and attached units distinguished themselves in support of military operations in the Republic of

Vietnam during the period 1 November 1966 through 31 October 1967. During this period the officers and men of the battalion were highly responsive to the constantly changing and increasing requirements for communications and communications support of Headquarters, United States Military Assistance Command, Vietnam; Headquarters, United States Army Vietnam and the other free world military forces in the Republic of Vietnam. With initiative, resourcefulness and professional competence, the organization's members transformed an obsolete manual telephone and communications system into a modern dial telephone system and greatly improved the communications-electronics service throughout Vietnam. Through timely, astute planning, meticulous attention to detail and expeditious and efficient resolution of myriad complex problems by the members of the 69TH SIGNAL BATTALION, the movement of Headquarters, United States Military Assistance Command, Vietnam and Headquarters, United States Army Vietnam took place with no significant communications failures. Through great personal sacrifice, hard work and professional competence, the battalion's personnel provided highly reliable communications support to the Allied efforts in the Republic of Vietnam. 39th Chemical Detachment

Reliable Academy (Provisional)

United States Army Special Security Group, Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Department of the Army, 9th Infantry Division Detachment".

7. Paragraph 2, Section VI, DA General Orders 31, 1969, pertaining to the award of the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Palm (Second Award) to the 1st Brigade, 9th Infantry Division and its assigned and attached units, is amended to delete, "5th Battalion, 60th Infantry".
